Breaking Barriers

HigherHER

Our HigherHER program helps unemployed and under-employed women gain professional skills, accelerate their job search and build confidence through the HigherHER career development program curriculum and our partnership with Cincinnati Works in our Career Center. In 2022, DFSC expanded HigherHER to multiple locations, ultimately allowing us to serve women where they are and helping to break barriers they may face.

We have begun to take this program to other agencies, where cohorts of women are preparing to enter or re-enter the workplace. In June 2022, we began presenting the program weekly at the Hamilton County Courthouse, to women in the CHANGE Court program. Through an alternative sentencing program, CHANGE Court serves women who have been charged with prostitution and related offenses and victims of sex trafficking.

As of January 2023, HigherHER is also being offered at Dohn Community High School to young women who are getting ready to graduate and join the workforce.

We are also in the process of formalizing partnerships to offer HigherHER on-site in multiple new locations. Stay tuned for more details in 2023!

In partnership with Easterseals Redwood, and through a contract administered by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, DFSC began work on a peer mentor initiative, known as the Benefits Bridge. As part of this program, we have welcomed Christina Wynn as our 'Peer Mentor,' mentoring clients referred by Hamilton County Job and Family Services, as well as DFSC clients. A 'Peer Mentor' is someone who has already bridged the gap between benefits and self-sufficiency themselves and, thus, can authentically relate, while providing our clients with a supportive mentoring relationship. The goal of Benefits Bridge peer mentors is to serve as role models and offer direct support to current public assistance recipients to champion their own paths towards independence.

DFSC has also joined the 513Relief Bus, a mobile service that provides resources, such as health screenings, social services and economic relief to residents all over Hamilton County. Clients are able to meet with our Peer Mentor and schedule appointments with DFSC.



Of the 9 women who graduated from the first cohort of the HigherHER career development program in 2022 (the return of the program post-pandemic), all 9 (100%) gained employment within 90 days of completing the program.

EmpowerHER

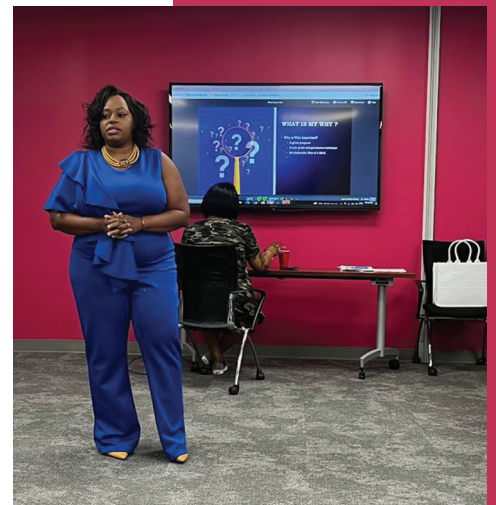
At Saturday meetings, women, no matter where they may be in their professional journey, build community and participate in professional development and life skills workshops.

81% of women who responded to our annual EmpowerHER survey reported that the program helped them reach their goals.

52% of women who responded to our annual survey reported that they achieved a personal, professional or financial milestone in 2022.

98% of women who responded to our annual survey were satisfied with their EmpowerHER experience.

In 2022, we covered a wide range of topics, including Breast Cancer Awareness, Easy and Healthy Cooking, Make-Up Classes, Home Ownership and many more!





StyleHER

Our signature interview and employment styling services, StyleHER focuses on outfitting women with confidence. StyleHER has dramatically expanded, helping us provide interview and employment outfits to a record-breaking number of women all over the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky region.

With the goal of meeting our clients where they are, we have expanded into two satellite locations and drastically increased the number of mobile stylings.

68% of StyleHER clients received an employment offer within 30 days of their Styling appointment.

98% of StyleHER clients reported they felt more prepared for their interview or employment following their styling appointment.

99% of StyleHER clients reported they would recommend StyleHER to a friend.

Through Her Eyes

Sandra's Story

Despite having a successful career in Human Resources and multiple high-paying corporate jobs, life took an unexpected turn and I found myself in a difficult situation—living in my friend's basement. My job had gone bankrupt, and my parents' declining health required my attention, leaving me with no choice but to prioritize my family. After their passing, I knew I had to return to the workforce, but consulting work proved to be unstable, forcing me to leave California and move to Lebanon, Ohio to stay with a friend.

However, just as I began job searching, COVID-19 hit the world, adding to my already overwhelming feeling of discouragement. I had to find a remote or part-time job due to my youngest son's special needs. It was during this time that I reached out to legal aid to receive help with my taxes. From there, legal aid referred me to The Care Center, where I met Mandy, and she introduced me to their variety of services, including Wheels Cinci, which helped me obtain a car!

In addition, I was introduced to Dress for Success Cincinnati and their Styling Coordinator, Missy. My appointment with Missy helped me feel like a million bucks! Together, we picked out a stunning black and white blazer. After my styling appointment, I had the privilege of speaking with Darlene from Cincinnati Works, who provided a safe and welcoming environment. I truly felt she understood exactly what I was going through.

Thanks to the support of Missy, Darlene, and the entire Dress for Success Cincinnati team, I was able to regain my confidence and secure a part-time job that, while not where I ultimately want to end up, is a stepping stone to bigger and better things. I am always eager to learn new skills and grow as a person, and I am excited to see what the future holds for me. I will always be grateful for the kindness and generosity of these organizations that helped me during a challenging time in my life.

2022 Fashion Show

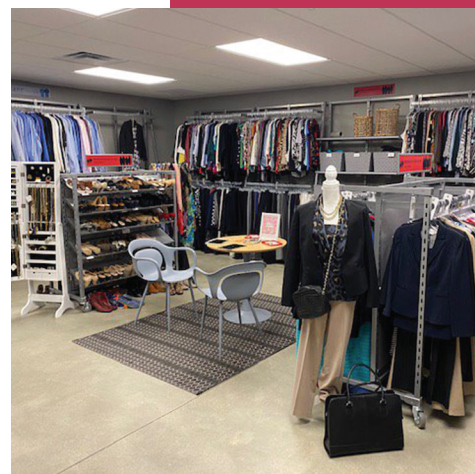

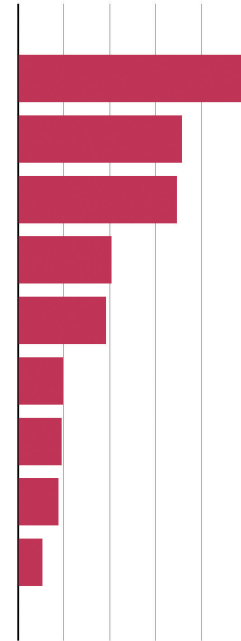

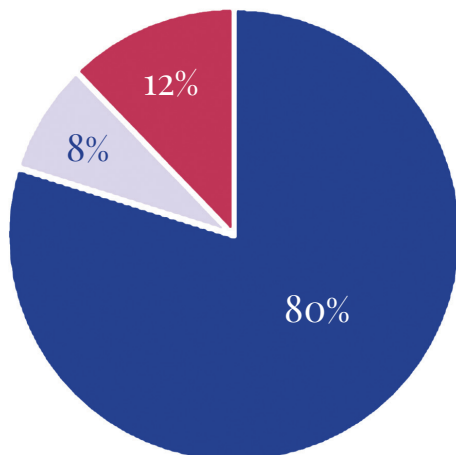
